There is some really exciting news regarding Walbottle Festival 2022. Since our public meeting on the 23rd of February the National Lottery has awarded our project £2738 and the City council have given approval to use the Green for our Street Party/Fete. So its full steam ahead for the celebrations on the bank holiday

weekend of the 2nd to the 4th of June!

This will not be the first time a Jubilee has been celebrated on the village green. In 1935 the Village had a party for King George V Silver Jubilee. Children re-enacted the special occasion with a procession while older members of the village participated in games.



What are we Planning this Jubilee?

Starting with a beacon lighting ceremony on the green on Thursday the 2nd followed by an activity in the village orchard on Friday and a street party/fete on Saturday afternoon. We aren't planning anything for Sunday but if local residents wish to use the green for a Big Jubilee Picnic Lunch and to meet their neighbours they are very welcome.

NCC will acquire the tree and plant it for us. The tree will be situated at the top of the Green near one of the lampposts. Many thanks to Rosie for her hard work lobbying the NCC for the tree which is planted as part of HM The Queen's Green Canopy.

Neighbourhood Watch

We have some good news here as well. We applied for an £800 grant from the Police and Crime Commissioners "Operation Payback" fund. This is a pot of money recovered from criminals in the North East and put back into the community to enhance crime prevention. We suggested buying some lamppost signs and window stickers. Defibrillator

Not so good news with our attempts to secure funding for a village defibrillator. Our second application has also been turned down. We haven't given up though but think funding may have to be generated within the village itself. If anyone would like to volunteer to raise funds please get in touch.

Interpretation Panels

There has been suggestions from local residents to erect an interpretation panel on the village green to provide some historical context for both residents and visitors. Walbottle Village has a long and proud history and it is believed we should celebrate and share this history with others. As a first step we are applying to the National Lottery Heritage fund for finances to buy and erect the panel. We need your help though as the National Lottery requires evidence of endorsement from local residents. If you agree (or indeed disagree) to an interpretation panel on the green let us know and we will be able to use your comments as evidence.

Operation Source

Did you know, that on the 22nd of September 1943 the German Battleship Tirpitz, sister ship to Bismark, was attacked and damaged by midget submarines called X craft. Six X craft were towed across the North Sea by 'mother' submarines to attack Tirpitz, Lutzow and Scharnhorst in an operation code named Operation Source. Only two X craft actually managed to plant charges under Tirpitz, the other four having sunk, broken down or the target ship had already sailed. One of the X craft, X5 unofficially named Platypus, was commanded by Lt Henty-Creer and second in command was Sub Lt Tom John Nelson who came from Walbottle. Tom, who was 22 at the time of the attack, was the son of Ralph and Frances Nelson who lived next door to the Village Institute. Sadly, Tom did not come home X5 having been destroyed by either a mine or shelling from Tirpitz, the exact cause of her loss will probably never be known. Out of the 24 men who took part in Operation Source, two Victoria crosses, three Distinguishes Service Orders, one Conspicuous Gallantry Medal and one Member of the order of the British Empire (MBE) were awarded. Tirpitz was disabled for 6 months by the attack and was eventually sunk by RAF bombing. The film 'Above us the Waves' pays tribute to those brave men.
