Broadband

We have emailed Cityfibre and the council for an update on the plans to bring fibre to Walbottle. Unfortunately we do not have a date for the work commencing and we have been unable to get a guarantee. We were assured last year that there were plans to bring it to Walbottle and therefore remain optimistic it is coming. We will keep chasing and update you with any developments.

Walbottle Village Institute - new Kitchen

The Institute kitchen has recently been refurbished and a bespoke modern kitchen installed. The project was largely funded by a grant of £9600 from the National Lottery but topped up from WVI funds. The work was carried out by John Freeman, owner of the Methodist Chapel in the Village. He took the kitchen back to bare walls then lovingly rebuilt it to the modern, bright and welcoming room it has become. With a new sink, two ovens, a hob and two fridges as well as ample cupboard space and worktops the Kitchen is now a wonderful place for those wishing to hire the hall for events. An opening ceremony was held on October the 23rd with guest of honour Ward Councillor Linda Wright who declared the new kitchen officially open. Other VIPs included Ward Councillor Steve Fairlie and our M.P. Mrs Catherine McKinnell. Many thanks to all the generous people who donated cakes and biscuits and helped serve tea and coffee. Donations totalling over £220 were raised for the nominated charity Macmillan Cancer Support. Thanks to all who attended the event.

Walbottle History: Ad Murum (At the Wall)

Did you know that in 653 King Peada of the Midland Angles visited a village in Northumberland called Ad Murum (meaning: At the Wall) to ask for the hand in marriage of Alchfled, the daughter of King Oswy. King Oswy would only grant his daughter's hand if Peada converted to the Christian faith. Peada agreed and was baptised by Bishop Finan along with all his nobles and Thegns. Later that same year King Sigebert of the East Saxons (Essex), also known as Sigebert the Little, visited Ad Murum to 'take the faith'. Bede states that Ad Murum was located alongside Hadrian's Wall on flat ground, 12 miles from the eastern sea and Dr Smith (editor of Beda) has identified Ad Murum as Walbottle (though other historians have suggested Heddon on the Wall or even Pandon in Newcastle). Things didn't turn out well for the newlyweds Peada and Alchfled. Peada was murdered in 656 by the treachery of Alchfled herself. There is a stained glass window to Alchfled in St Wystans church, Repton, Derbyshire. An unusual tribute to a murderer!
