Gardening group

We have had a quiet Autumn and Winter however the gardening group continue to manage and maintain the existing flower beds and tubs. A big thank you to everyone who have helped especially, Steve, Samantha, Sylvia, Kelly, Kim, Rosie, Wendy, Nick and Sacha.

The shady triangle has changed significantly since the last newsletter now that the Council have cut down a very large tree. So we may need to re-name the shady triangle. We still need to take advice on the best plants and shrubs for the rock bed in that area. This will be easier when as we can now identify where the daffodils are. The raised bed in front of Head to Toe has been emptied and plants saved for replanting elsewhere. We plan to plant this bed up in late March to early April. The Percy Way Rose Beds have been pruned, weeded and topped up with soil improver. Bulbs in these beds are coming through for some spring colour. As reported in our last newsletter the 2 sets of 3 planters by the entrance to Walbottle Farm have not been very successful, possibly due to the overhanging trees and difficulty of access for watering. Our plan is to move these and we hope to do so over the next month. The Jubilee bed will be given a re-vamp to replace the annuals with perennials and possibly small shrubs to minimise maintenance and management of the bed.

We are always looking for volunteers for one off projects or general weeding and planting. We do try to have group sessions to do this which is much more fun than doing it solo and a good opportunity to get to know everyone. Our new organiser is Nick Strong who has kindly agreed to lead on this important group for the village. We received funding for this initiative in 2022 and have now taken delivery of window stickers (see below) and a number of road signs which will be displayed at the outskirts and around the village.

This scheme is even more important at this time given the rise in thefts and continued anti social behaviour in the area. It is also important to note that there is a question on all home insurance policy questionnaires so this can save you money on insurance policies but only if you have joined the scheme. Simply key in your postcode and you will be directed to the Walbottle Village Neighbourhood Watch Scheme (WVNWS) page where you can join and receive regular updates. Zone' and awaiting advice from Newcastle Trading

Standards. You may receive a consultation letter on the proposal for a No Cold Calling Zone. If so, we urge you to respond so that the council are able to gauge the individual support (or otherwise) for the scheme.

You will find a 'No Cold Calling' window sticker purchased by the Neighbourhood Watch with this Newsletter. Peel off the backing strip and place it on a window where it can be seen by anyone approaching your house. Also included with this Newsletter is a Neighbourhood Watch leaflet containing more information and the link details above.

Past and Present Residents

Its always great to hear from past and present residents from Walbottle and memories they have of our lovely village. We recently received an email from the great grandson of a local resident who used to live in Old Row (which was called New Row when first built). Old Row is long demolished but used to stand where Grove road is today and comprised 21 back to back cottages with one room downstairs and one up accessed via a ladder. The cottages were cleared under Newburn Urban District Council's slum clearance programme with three new terraces replacing them.

Six Degrees of Separation by David Armstrong

Researching my family tree I found my Grandfather's birth certificate; dated 9/12/1890, New Row, Walbottle. His Father, Joseph Armstrong, was a haulier and accomplished cyclist. Some of his prizes can be seen in the 1st photograph. The second a plaque, (used on a display featuring his Whitworth racer) shows his results over a short period in the late 1800's. In 1975 my apprenticeship began at a factory in Coventry, originally Rudge Whitworth where Great Grandad's racer was built. Years later my wife introduced me to her friends who live in Walbottle, 6-degree theory proven!

Exploring Hadrian's Wall through Newcastle

Following on from the film "Gannin alang the wall" showing the real route of Hadrian's Wall through Newcastle, Judith Green has asked the WVT&RA if they could host a walk around Walbottle to include a talk and refreshments in the Village Institute for a group of up to 20 people. Judith is passionate about highlighting the route of the wall between Heddon and Wallsend as the 'Official' route follows the riverside from Heddon missing many places of interest, including Walbottle! There are five walks in all with Walbottle being the first on the 29 of June followed by Denton Burn 6 July, Central Newcastle 13 July, Ouseburn 20 July and Segadunum 27 July.
